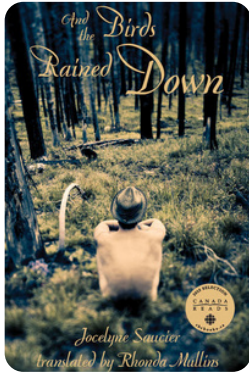

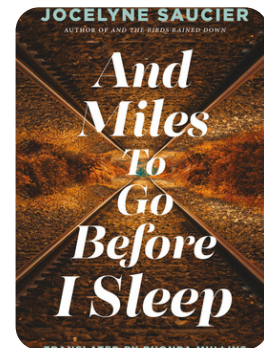
## And Miles To Go Before I Sleep

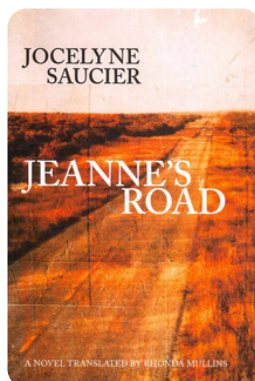
